## **Pupil Premium Information Statement 2018-2019**

Pupil Premium provides additional funding to school to target specific groups of children who are vulnerable to underachievement. These children can be from low income families, children who are looked after and children of armed service personnel.

For this Academic Year, we have:

- 1 child who is a Post Looked After Child. School receive £4200 for this child.
- 1 child who has previously received Free School Meals. School receive £1320 for this child.

The total amount Chollerton First School will receive this year is £5520. This money will be used for targeted support as per our Pupil Premium Plan.

Writing	<ul> <li>Teacher letter formation through frequent practise.</li> <li>Use OT materials to improve hand control and fine motor skills.</li> <li>Make links explicit between spoken language and written sentences.</li> <li>Provide 1 to 1 support.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Letter formation will be in 1 fluent stroke.</li> <li>OT materials will improve direction of lines.</li> <li>Child will be able to translate oral work into sentences; then be able to write them down with increasing confidence.</li> </ul>	£1106

- 1 to 1 support from all staff.
