Welcome to the Summer Term. Our theme this term will be Here is an outline of work:


Patterns




Greedy Zebra:

Punctuation: Capitals, full stops, exclamation and question marks.


Numeracy

- Algebra, e.g.: $8 \square = 5$. Using stories to illustrate algebra problems, e.g. There were 8 apples on the tree, the wind blew and 5 were left on the tree. How many fell off?
- Odd and even patterns.
- Number investigations.
- 1 less, 10 less, 20 less, 30 less.
- 1 more, 10 more, 20 more, 30 more. 100 square patterns.
- Number sequences: 2's, 3's, 5's, 10's.
- Addition strategies.
- We will work on weight, beginning with heavier, lighter than and progressing to look at the weights adults use. Kilogram and grams.
