- Talk about how a person might feel when they receive flowers.
- Do you have a favourite mini beast?
  Why? Is there a mini beast you don't like? Why?
- Talk about caring for mini beasts and setting up homes.

Expressive Art and Design

- Discuss Van Gogh Sunflower painting and do an observational painting of a sunflower.
- Use salt dough to make minibeasts.
- Mixing different shades of green paint to paint frogs.

#### Understanding the World

- Go on a mini beast hunt. Discuss the different place we find mini beasts.
- Make our own mini beast houses.
- Plant our own sunflower seeds.
- Learn the different parts of a plant.
- Discuss what plants need to grow.
