Rivers of Hope

A piece of our children's artwork is going to be on display in the Queen's Platinum Jubilee pageant on Sunday 5th June. The project was part of the "River of Hope" organised by the Thames Festival Trust in which two hundred images produced by children from schools across the UK are to be printed onto silk flags and processed through the streets of London.

The design was created as a collaboration between Chollerton First School and Whitley Chapel First School in Northumberland and is entitled 'Nurture Nature'. It shows how people around the world use water for washing, drinking and growing plants. The design also shows all the life below water that needs water to be unpolluted; the fish are made from the food we eat. The world is busy but there is enough water for humans and for all other species on Earth but only if we protect our water supplies.
